TYPICAL DUTIES

- » Perform construction, maintenance, and operation of lines, substations and equipment.
- » Ascend and descend wood poles, steel and lattice towers. String, splice and deadend and sag conductor.
- » Have the capability of doing energized live line work using hotstick and live line bare hand work methods, or be trained to do this work.
- » Operate and maintain NPPD vehicles and hydraulic equipment.

The OTTP is a two-year program in which the Technician In-Training will be placed in vacant positions or where there is a business need. They will receive all benefits of a regular, full-time employee during the two-year program. Must be willing and able to relocate anywhere within the state of Nebraska and must be willing to work in a Transmission AND Distribution (T&D) environment.
